### Technology

- The siyyum will be streamed through the internet; to access the link:

- You will need a computer, projector, sound system and a screen
- Projector: It should be measured at 5,000 antisiloments for a larger screen and 3,000 for a small one. The size of screen depends of the size of the hall. Determine ahead of time what type of screen would best fit your venue.

### **Questions**

Question: Are there pre-made handouts that go to the individuals for the learning?

Answer: Yes, you should print out the pages from the curriculum guidebook.

Question: Are we sending something for Birkat Hatorah?
